Wilmington Community Clinic (WCC) is founded.

WCC becomes a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC).

2013

WCC adds Behavioral Health Services.

2017

WCC adds dental Services.

2019

WCC recognized as a Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH).

2022

WCC opens a school-based health center at Wilmington Middle School.

2025

WCC adds podiatry services.

Why We Matter

WCC serves over 6,700 patients in 18 ZIP codes across the South Bay and South Los Angeles - a region of over 880,000 people.

96% of WCC patients live below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL)

87% of WCC patients live below the poverty line

Median income for population served by WCC is \$16,000, compared to \$80,000 countywide

Per capita income among patients is \$26,628, compared to \$37,924 in Los Angeles County



Leaders in Health Equity

Wilmington Community Clinic is proud to be a top performer in care delivery for our patients. With outcomes that outpace industry standards, WCC proves that high-quality care and deep community connection go hand in hand.

Wilmington Community Clinic received the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Health Center Quality Recognition Badge at Gold level three times in recent years - 2021, 2023, and 2024. Nationally, just over 10% of all Federally Qualified Health Centers are recognized for this achievement; in California, less than 8% are qualified. This recognition reflects WCC's outstanding performance on our clinical Uniform Data System (UDS) measures.



Gaps in Access

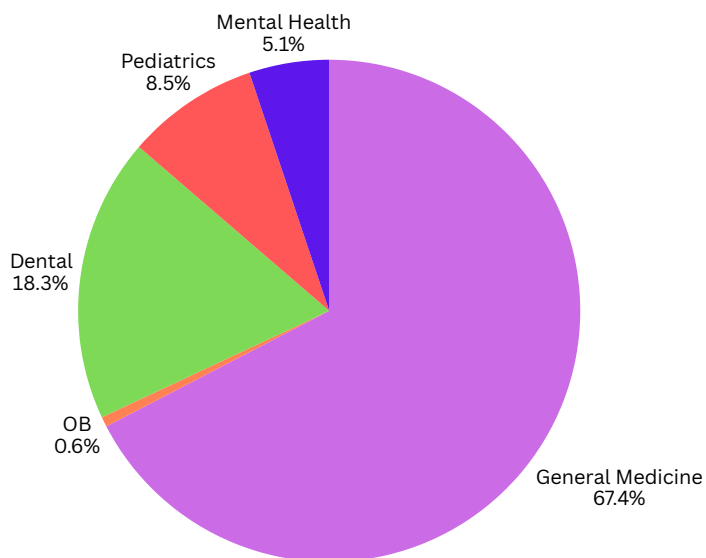
- 81.7% rely on Medicaid, Medicare, or public insurance
- 16% are uninsured
- Changes in benefits at state and federal levels threaten many patients' access to care.

WCC is proud to rank in the 90th percentile nationwide for several key quality assurance metrics, as measured by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)

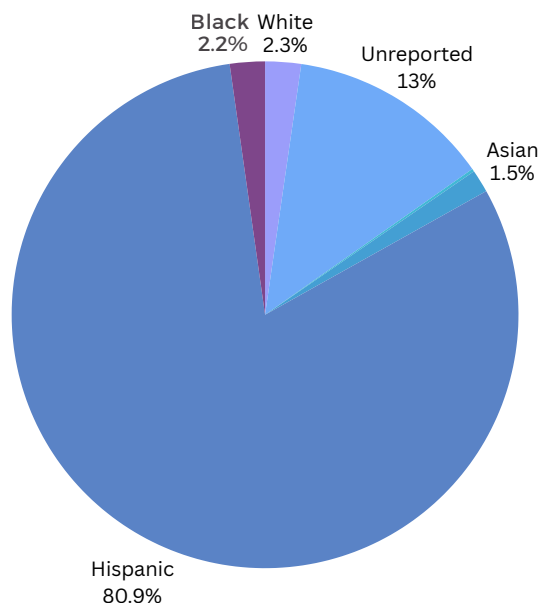
